> Minutes of Meeting August 21, 1987

The regular Commission Meeting of August 21, 1987 was called to order by Dr. J. Dale Nations, Chairman, at 10:02 A.M. in the Commission's office.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF MEETING OF MAY 15, 1987

A motion was made by Mrs. Wilt and seconded by Mrs. Niccoli:

THAT THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF MAY 15, 1987 BE APPROVED AS PRESENTED.

Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dr. Daniel Brennan, the Executive Director, reviewed his Activity Report previously sent to the Commissioners and made a part of these minutes. He reported that Petroleum Technical Services spudded its first well this week in the Yuma area. Dr. Brennan advised that Gordon LeBlanc, an oil operator in Louisiana, plans to drill several wells this coming year in the Four Corners area. He suggested getting a dedicated word processor instead of another typewriter. The estimated purchase price would be less than \$1,000.00. Dr. Brennan explained that Arizona Public Service is to donate well records of oil and gas wells to the Commission. He will write to them advising of their worth to the Commission. Dr. Brennan gave an explanation of injection wells noted in his Activity Report.

REPORT OF ENFORCEMENT SECTION

Mr. R. A. Ybarra, Enforcement Director, reviewed his Activity Report previously sent to the Commissioners and made a part of these minutes.

Ngust 21, 1987 Page - 2 -

Mr. Ybarra reviewed a memo of his regarding testing of Cal Gas' wells. They are to drill three 400' holes and set 5-1/2" casing; they are getting vacuum pumps and drilling 22 shallow holes throughout the property and will monitor them. Dr. Brennan and Mr. Ybarra are to meet with Cal Gas on September 3, 1987.

Mr. Ybarra advised that testing of BOP equipment was done this week in Yuma by Petroleum Technical Services. The operator is drilling ahead. Mr. Ybarra displayed a new cover for the Well Location Map Four, and advised that the maps have been brought up-to-date and are at the printer for finalizing.

REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY ABANDONMENT PERIOD BY CAM-ROY RESEARCH CORPORATION

Mr. Ralph Pomeroy requested another extension of time due to problems of title of the property in Higley regarding the geothermal wells. Mr. Rex Wisehart, formerly with Prudential-Bache, and now associated with Mr. Pomeroy, explained that he had been served with a quiet title action. There is a possibility of getting permission from the court to examine the condition of the wells as they might have to be plugged. Pomeroy has funds available for this purpose if necessary. Mr. John Feegan, of the Attorney General's office, will get further information to assist the Commission in this endeavor. Mr. Pomeroy advised that financing is in place, and adjacent property is being acquired. Mr. Ybarra explained of possible corrosion problems if the wells remain unplugged.

Following this discussion, Mrs. Wilt moved and Mr. Bennett seconded:

THAT THE EXTENSION OF THE TEMPORARY ABANDONMENT BE FOR SIX MONTHS WITH A REQUEST THAT THE COURT ALLOW TESTING BEFORE WE CONSIDER FURTHER EXTENSION OF THE TEMPORARY ABANDONMENT.

Motion carried unanimously. Dr. Brennan is to write to a judge or the court stating our concerns for the testing.

CONSIDERATION OF FY '89 BUDGET REQUEST

After the review of the budget request for 1989 by Dr. Brennan, it was suggested that an additional \$500.00 be listed to buy technical manuals. The total request is \$195,300.00 for the '89 budget.

August 21, 1987 Page - 3 -

Dr. Nations suggested that Dr. Brennan contact the governor's office regarding the out-of-state travel representative. Dr. Nations advised that an invitation was extended to the IOCC to meet in December 1988 in Arizona.

A motion was made by Mrs. Niccoli and seconded by Mr. Bennett:

THAT THE BUDGET BE APPROVED AS AMENDED.

Motion carried unanimously.

Dr. Nations encouraged Dr. Brennan to prepare a paper for the next annual AAPG Meeting in San Antonio.

REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF EFFORT TO AUTHORIZE A PUBLICATION REVOLVING FUND

Following a discussion to establish a publication revolving fund, a motion was made by Mrs. Wilt and seconded by Mrs. Niccoli:

THAT A REQUEST BE MADE TO THE LEGISLATURE FOR APPROVAL OF A REVOLVING PUBLICATION FUND.

Motion carried unanimously.

DISCUSSION OF REVIEW AND REVISION OF RULES

Dr. Brennan discussed the revision of the Rules of the Commission. Approximately 15 Rules are to be changed. There is a mandate to do this every five years.

CALL TO THE PUBLIC

Dr. Fellows, state geologist, of the Geological Survey Branch in Tucson advised this is the last year to be a part of the University of Arizona. It will then become an official state agency.

The next meeting is tentatively set for October 15 or 16 and possibly in Yuma depending on the progress of the well drilling of Petroleum Technical Services. Mr. Ybarra will arrange a trip to the Cerro Prieto geothermal plant which is 45 km south of Mexicali.

At the request of Dr. Nations, Dr. Brennan will check into the election of a chairman for the Commission.

ACTIVITY REPORT

We have submitted our Fiscal Year 1989 Budget request after making some minor changes and arithmetic corrections. The budget request was sent in before the September 1 deadline.

Our secretary has resigned and Lois Rogers who worked here previously will be coming back effective October 26.

The 1987 Convention of the Geological Society of America will be held in Phoenix, October 25 to 29. I have been involved in hiring rental vehicles for many of the field trips to be held in connection with the meeting. We are expecting up to 4,000 people to attend this convention, which makes it a large convention for Phoenix.

The Department of Environmental Quality is initiating an effort to achieve State primacy on the matter of underground injection wells. We have had some preliminary meetings with them. The plan is to keep supervision of oil-and gas-related injection wells in the Oil and Gas Commission.

I have contacted legislators in both the House of Representatives and the Senate who have agreed to sponsor a bill to establish a Publication Revolving Fund for the Oil and Gas Commission. I have contacted the Governor's Office and received encouragement there as well.

ACTIVITY REPORT

R. A. Ybarra Ry Enforcement Director

On September 3, Dan and I, along with representatives from Department of Environmental Quality and Attorney General's Office, met with a group from Cal Gas to review the status of the propane leak incident at the Cal Gas Storage Facility in Glendale and to discuss the forthcoming drilling of a new well, taking into consideration all prudent precautions, including but not limited to, well design, corrosion problems, and land subsidence. A subsidence monitoring program similar to that planned for the neighboring Southwest Salt project was discussed.

On this same day, I attended a meeting called together by Water Resources Associates, Inc., as contractor for the Department of Water Resources, to conduct a study of several state agencies and commissions that may have some authority to regulate various aspects of water quality or whose activities may affect water quality. This study's aim is to identify opportunities for cooperative efforts between the various agencies and commissions and to provide better protection to the waters of the state.

At our last meeting, I reported that Petroleum Technical Services Company had spudded Well No. 4-1 Federal on August 17, the first of two wells to be drilled in the Yuma area. On August 26, I witnessed cementing of the 10 3/4" casing at 3116' with 1700 sacks of cement. An additional 50 sacks of cement were pumped in from the surface through 1" pipe hanging at 86', and filling to the surface. I also witnessed the installation and testing of the blowout prevention equipment prior to drilling ahead below 3116'. A 9 7/8" hole was drilled to 7000'. Volcanics were penetrated from 6300' all the way to total depth so the operator decided to plug the hole. The hole was logged and on September 12, I witnessed the placement of cement plugs 5100'-5005' and 3160'-2965'. After removal of the BOP stack a 40-foot cement plug was placed at the surface.

The second well, No. 26-1 Federal, started drilling on September 22 and, as of September 23, the operator was preparing to cement 16" conductor casing at 315'.
