

Minutes of Meeting  
September 15, 1989

The regular Commission Meeting of September 15, 1989 was called to order by Dr. J. Dale Nations, Chairman, at 10:00 A.M. in the Commission's office.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF MEETING AND OF THE EXECUTIVE SESSION OF JULY 21, 1989

Mr. Warne moved, seconded by Mrs. Wilt:

THAT THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING AND OF THE EXECUTIVE  
SESSION OF JULY 21, 1989 BE ACCEPTED AS PRESENTED.

Motion carried unanimously.

HEARING ON CHUSKA ENERGY: REQUEST FOR 160-ACRE SPACING FOR GAS, BLACK  
ROCK FIELD

At 10:05 A.M., the hearing regarding Chuska Energy Company concerning 160-acre spacing for gas in the Black Rock Field started. Minutes for that hearing are presented separately.

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Activity Report of Dr. Brennan was sent to the Commissioners, and has been made a part of these minutes. He reported on the recent move to our new location. A budget request of \$192,600.00 was submitted for 1991. Dr. Brennan explained the request of reductions in the budget of 5% and 15% would involve eliminating personnel to obtain a vacancy savings.

Mrs. Wilt moved, seconded by Mr. Warne:

THAT THE BUDGET FOR 1991 BE ACCEPTED.

Motion carried unanimously.

Dr. Brennan advised that Chuska Energy plans to drill five more wells. He stated that he has had calls from Dan Foster of Dallas and Amarillo concerning helium. The price for helium has increased considerably. The 1989 legislature passed a law effective September 15, 1989, which will permit the making of agreements with other agencies and with Indian Tribes.

REPORT OF OIL & GAS SPECIALIST

The Activity Report of Mr. Rauzi was sent to the Commissioners, and has been made a part of these minutes. Mr. Rauzi reported that no one appeared to bid at the recent BLM lease sale. He reported that his map project is completed, and that he is splicing the negatives together. Considerable interest has been generated by this map.

Dr. Brennan mentioned that Jay Shields plans to start drilling a Precambrian test in mid-October.

CAM-ROY RESEARCH CORPORATION VS. OIL AND GAS COMMISSION

The Commission's attorney, Carol Lewin, advised that Cam-Roy's lawsuit against the Commission has been dismissed.

PLUGGING OF GEOTHERMAL WELLS, CHANDLER AREA

Ms. Lewin informed the Commission that the landowners of the Power Ranches are suing the Cam-Roy Research Corporation to plug the wells, and are waiting for the court to rule. Dr. Brennan commented on a recent visit by Mr. Pomeroy who said he would not plug the wells. He says he owns the minerals in the wells. After considerable discussion, it was agreed that a letter should be sent to the landowners to let them know of the Commission's interest in having the wells plugged.

INTERSTATE OIL COMPACT COMMISSION MEETING IN ARIZONA

Dr. Nations reported that there was no further information on this meeting since the Commissioners met on July 21, 1989. He will pursue this for the next meeting.

MOTION TO AUTHORIZE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO ACT FOR THE COMMISSION

At the suggestion of Dr. Nations, this subject was tabled until the next meeting.

CALL TO THE PUBLIC

John Haas of the Bureau of Land Management advised that he notified the BLM Office in New Mexico of the hearing of Chuska Energy Company. He commented that there was not much activity, and that no one attended the recent lease sale.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Dr. Nations told of a conversation with Sandra Junck, Special Assistant to Governor Mofford, regarding the replacement of a Commissioner who had terminated. An effort will be made to get some nominees for this position.

Dr. Brennan reported that he has been invited to give a talk at the Sun City Petroleum Club next month.

The next meeting was scheduled for November 17, 1989.

ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Warne moved, seconded by Mrs. Wilt:

THAT THE MEETING BE ADJOURNED.

Motion passed unanimously. Time of adjournment was 12:00 Noon.

ACTIVITY REPORT

Daniel J. Brennan

Since your last meeting, we have had quite a bit of traffic through the office. Most of it has been from individuals and small independents, some of whom are repeat callers. They have shown interest in several parts of the state, and express determination to come back and file for drilling permits. So far they have not.

We do have seven applications for permits to drill gas wells in the area you ordered spaced in September. Chuska has also applied to EPA, and has applied for a permit to convert an existing shut-in well into a salt water disposal well.

I went through every well file in our library, and copied every gas and water analysis I found. There were not many, but what I found I have assembled into files which should be useful.

Steve and I made an inspection tour of the producing wells in the Four Corners Area. Since the H<sub>2</sub>S blowout event at Black Rock, Kerr-McGee has built high fences and posted H<sub>2</sub>S warnings at their producing wells at Dineh-bi-Keyah.

Enclosed with this report is a suggested list of subjects on which the Director may act for the Commission. After each suggestion is a reference to the relevant rule.

The items suggested for the Director's authority are those which involve application of rules and are more or less routine and involve field decisions.

The items reserved to the Commission are those which involve policy making.

This is essentially the way we have been working. It is desirable to have a clear record of the authorization to avoid legal pitfalls, such as suits to avoid compliance because the authorization was not formalized. This is part of the fallout from legal cases in other agencies.

We inspected the new Sunbelt Refining Company near Coolidge. We had a brief tour through the facility and reminded them to file reports monthly.

We have been working on getting bonds from Tran Am Energy and Dry Mesa Corporation. Both posted bonds, but because we gave incorrect instructions, replacements had to be provided. Dry Mesa has now posted bond, and we are awaiting the bond from Tran Am.

We have been studying the Black Rock/Dry Mesa area with respect to Chuska's application for a disposal well, and will be prepared to make a recommendation at the hearing on December 15.

ACTIVITY REPORT

November 30, 1989

Since the Commission meeting in September, TranAm Energy drilled a stratigraphic test well near Red Lake and Chuska Energy Company applied for seven additional wells (Black Rock numbers 5 through 11) in the Black Rock field. Chuska also submitted their application for approval to re-complete the Black Rock No. 4 (State Permit No. 610) as a water disposal well.

Dan and I spent several days in the field inspecting the production operations in northern Apache County and I inspected the Adamana storage facility. We also toured the new Sunbelt Refinery near Chandler.

The operations at Black Rock, Dry Mesa, East Boundary Butte, Teec Nos Pos, and Dineh-bi-Keyah fields were clean, well managed, and in compliance with applicable rules. The LPG storage facility near Adamana was in good condition and a new flare was in place at the brine ponds. The Sunbelt Refinery near Chandler is technically state-of-the-art and includes a well equipped laboratory. Our refinery monthly reports indicate that they delivered their first product in September.
