

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

The regular Commission Meeting of December 15, 1989 was called to order by Dr. J. Dale Nations, Chairman, at 10:00 A.M. in Room B-144, 5150 North 16th Street, Phoenix, Arizona 85016.

HEARING ON CHUSKA ENERGY: APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF A DISPOSAL WELL
SEC. 6, T40N-R29E, APACHE COUNTY, ARIZONA

At 10:03 A.M., Dr. Brennan gave an explanation of the purpose of the hearing for Chuska Energy Company. Mr. David Apker, attorney for Chuska Energy Company, introduced Mr. Tom McCarthy, a senior reservoir engineer with Chuska, who made his presentation for the approval of a permit for the disposal well. The hearing ended at 11:00 A.M.

At 11:02 A.M., the regular Commission Meeting resumed.

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Activity Report of Dr. Brennan was sent to the Commissioners, and has been made a part of these minutes. Dr. Brennan reported TranAm Energy has provided a bond for its well. While they secured a permit from the Water Department, it is necessary to get the drilling permit from the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission.

REPORT OF OIL AND GAS SPECIALIST

The Activity Report of Mr. Rauzi was sent to the Commissioners, and has

been made a part of these minutes. He reported on a recent visit with Dr. Brennan to Sun Belt Refinery near Chandler. Sun Belt will send their monthly reports on a regular basis. He notified the authorized transporters of the condensate and the gas at the Black Rock Field of their reporting requirements.

PLUGGING OF GEOTHERMAL WELLS, CHANDLER AREA

Mr. John Saxman, representing Cam-Roy Research and Development Corporation in Chandler, advised that he had no comment regarding this subject. Mr. Rauzi advised that Keith Powers of the Powers Ranches called to get information on these wells.


Dr. Brennan stated that the 1.1% budget cut by the Governor had been met by our agency.

ACTIVITY REPORT

Since your last meeting, I have taken a couple of weeks of vacation, and, just as I returned to work, I came down with the flu and missed five more days of work.

We are in the final stages of preparation for the publication of a new version of our well listing and map, and of Steve's report on possible Precambrian sources of petroleum in northern Arizona.

The legislature is in session, so I have been carefully monitoring what is going on there. As I reported to you earlier, Senator Corbet has, in draft stage, a bill to merge the Department of Mines and Mineral Resources, the State Geological Survey, and the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission into the Land Department. Apparently, he also has a bill to eliminate the State Mine Inspector's office.

I provided comments on the bill affecting the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission to a Senate researcher working for Senator Sossaman (R, Higley) who is chairman of the Senate Natural Resources and Agriculture Committee. In general I did not support the concept because I see a potential conflict of interest in the Land Department's regulating oil and gas on private and federal as well as state land, because I don't see any saving, because it will probably cost more, and also because the bill did not provide any structure in the Land Department to insure that the three agencies could actually continue to function.

As of today, I believe the bill has not been actually introduced. I will keep up the vigil and keep you informed.

So far no other legislative issues with the potential to affect our duties has come to light.

We had our budget hearing before a House Appropriations subcommittee on January 23.

The Joint Legislative Budget Committee (JLBC) recommends elimination of the allowance for general inflation and elimination of the Secretarial position and a raise for Steve Rauzi for a decrease of \$15,400 or 8.2% from our adjusted budget request.

The Executive Budget Office (EBO--the Governor's Office) recommendation is for a continuation budget, no raise for Steve and a general \$8,800 (4.8%) across-the-board cut from our request. This would require layoffs of two people for about nine weeks or so. If we get a lump sum appropriation, and we usually do, we could probably cut the length of the layoffs to some degree.

We had a generally friendly reception, but no promises. There were also questions about possible mergers and/or creation of a giant department of natural resources. It is impossible for me to predict what is going to happen.

At your meeting, we will have a hearing on another proposed water disposal well. This proposal is from Dry Mesa Corporation, which has the Mississippian oil wells just northwest of the area controlled by Chuska Energy. They propose to inject water separated from the oil back into the Mississippian in one of their wells in which the oil has been depleted.

Chuska Energy Company commenced their drilling program at the Black Rock Field in January. They spudded the No. 8 well on January 10 and moved in a second rig to spud the No. 5 well on January 23. I witnessed the cementing of surface casing and pressure tests of the BOPE on both the No. 8 and No. 5 wells. I also witnessed the two-stage cementing of the production string on the No. 8 well. Chuska hopes to complete their drilling program sometime in March before the Peregrine Falcon courtship process begins.

PB-KBB submitted a workover program for the Roach-Baker No. 3 well at the Glendale LPG storage facility. We approved the rework plan which will result in a new string of casing cemented to about 1,500 feet. The program includes the required mechanical integrity test before returning the cavern to service. This rework will complete the program begun last year to upgrade the three caverns currently in use at the Glendale facility. PB-KBB anticipates the workover to commence in mid-February depending on the activity level at the caverns.

Ken Hand submitted an application to convert the Navajo 138-1 well, in the Dry Mesa Field, to a salt water disposal well. His plan is a straight-forward proposal to reinject water produced from the Leadville Formation directly back into the Leadville. Through December, 1989, about 1,700,000 barrels of water and about 750,000 barrels of oil have been produced from the Leadville at the Dry Mesa field.

Don Elston of the US Geological Survey reviewed my Precambrian report in January. He provided several absolute age dates and suggestions which I am currently incorporating into the manuscript and map.
