> Minutes of Meeting February 15, 1991

The regular Commission Meeting of February 15, 1991 was called to order by Dr. J. Dale Nations, Chairman, at 10:01 A.M. in Room B-141, 5150 North 16th Street, Phoenix, Arizona 85016.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF MEETING OF NOVEMBER 16, 1990

Mrs. Murphy moved, seconded by Mr. Warne:

THAT THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF NOVEMBER 16, 1990 BE ACCEPTED AS PRESENTED.

Motion carried unanimously.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Mr. Warne moved, seconded by Mrs. Murphy:

THAT JAN C. WILT BE NOMINATED FOR CHAIRMAN FOR A TWO-YEAR PERIOD.

Motion carried unanimously.

Dr. Nations moved, seconded by Mrs. Wilt:

THAT JAMES E. WARNE BE NOMINATED FOR VICE-CHAIRMAN FOR A TWO-YEAR PERIOD.

Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Activity Report of Dr. Brennan was sent to the Commissioners, and has been made a part of these minutes. He gave copies of a recent report compiled of the activities of the Commission, and plans to do this on a semi-annual basis. The JLBC did not recommend funding for this agency next year.

Dr. Brennan explained that Mr. Rauzi, the Oil and Gas Specialist, was conducting a Mechanical Integrity Test on an injection well operated by Merrion Oil Company and checking on a recent oil spill at Black Rock—the reason for his absence from the meeting.

Minutes of Meeting February 15, 1991 Page - 2 -

Dr. Brennan has met with all the members of the Appropriations Subcommittees regarding our budget. He explained to them what we are doing and that there are five plays going on in the state. Interest has been created in the Precambrian due to Mr. Rauzi's recent report; re-entry of a well in Tombstone is proposed by an operator from Midland; an operator from Denver is interested in acreage in western Maricopa County; an operator from Billings, MT has requested that BLM put over 200,000 acres up for auction in the western part of the state; an operator from Tulsa wanted to know the rules for drilling in northwestern Arizona. A company out of Tulsa is working on an LPG storage project at Red Lake. Another company is exploring in Cochise County.

A set of underground injection rules has been sent to DEQ for review. Dr. Brennan wants to write rules on pits to reflect the 1986 environmental law, the Oil and Gas laws and Federal requirements. He would like an agreement with DEQ for us to permit pits under our rules.

Dr. Brennan requested that the Attorney General to go to court to require plugging of the geothermal wells in the Chandler area.

He advised that an operator plugged three wells without notifying anyone in Teec Nos Pos last October. The wells may have to be re-entered for plugging. He is working with the BLM.

REPORT OF OIL AND GAS SPECIALIST

The Activity Report of Mr. Rauzi was sent to the Commissioners, and has been made a part of these minutes. Mr. Rauzi was not in attendance due to field inspections.

Dr. Brennan advised that 160 copies of Mr. Rauzi's Precambrian report have been distributed, and he continues working on the Wittman study.

PLUGGING OF GEOTHERMAL WELLS, CHANDLER AREA

Dr. Brennan referred this case to the Attorney General's office. Carol Lewin, our legal counsel, stated with the new attorney general coming into office, no action has been taken, and there will probably be a delay for a month.

DISCUSSION OF FY 92 BUDGET REQUEST

Dr. Brennan reported that two previously scheduled hearings were never held. Another is set for the House hearing on Tuesday, February 19, at 7:00 P.M.; the Senate hearing will be Friday, February 22, at 2:00 P.M. He asked the Commissioners to write letters to the Governor's office in behalf of the Commission. He reported several letters have been received in our behalf from various individuals and firms. Dr. Brennan outlined the enclosures he prepared for a packet given to various legislators to encourage them to retain the Commission.

Minutes of Meeting February 15, 1991 Page - 3 -

Dr. Nations recommended placing a copy of an article in the "Arizona Geological Society Digest" in the legislative packet, and that sequential numbering be used for the Oil and Gas Report.

Reference was made to Number 6 on the agenda by Dr. Nations. Mr. Saxman, representing Cam-Roy Research and Development Corporation, at the November 16, 1990 meeting stated that within a 90-day period they hoped to have more information on their project. Mr. Warne expressed concern of the condition of the wells, and that it is the responsibility of the Commission to take care of them. Mr. Pomeroy responded that the wells are monitored every year, and there is no reason to plug them from a danger standpoint. Mr. Pomeroy spoke in favor of continuing the Commission in its vital work. He referred to the Chandler-Higley Basin being worth 40 to 60 billion dollars in energy production, and these resources need to be developed.

PLUGGING OF WELL IN YUMA AREA

Dr. Brennan stated that a plan has been filed to plug Contender Oil Company's well by February 21, 1991. This case was previously referred to the Attorney General's office as a proposal had not been received.

CALL TO THE PUBLIC

No action.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

The next meeting is scheduled for April 19, 1991.

Dr. Nations stated he would like more information on a report involving the Higley Basin. Dr. Brennan will obtain this information.

The principal focus of our attention over the past six weeks has been whether or not the legislature will appropriate funds for the agency for the next fiscal year. Basically, nothing has happened since your last meeting. In the wake of the Azscam scandal, the legislature was virtually paralyzed until their hearings on ousting accused members ended.

Adding to the political indecision was the run-off election for governor. Governor Symington will make his views on the budget known soon, probably this week (written April 1, 1991.)

I continued to visit with members of the legislature, but have received no commitments to favor appropriation for the Commission. A recurring theme is "wait to see what the Governor proposes."

The week after the inauguration, I visited with two members of Governor Symington's staff. I think the argument that we serve to promote and do promote and assist oil and gas exploration in the state was well-received.

During our meeting, it was suggested that our activities could very well fit into the Department of Commerce. In the past week, several newspapers have had articles saying that the Governor wants to reorganize the Commerce Department.

In the meantime, we have been busy with other work as well.

A Mr. Ed Kaufman of Albuquerque has called us to say that he expects to start very soon on a geothermal hot dry rock project near Nutrioso.

Once this project starts, we will recommend to you that you require reinjection of produced waters to be sure the wells fall under Geothermal Laws rather than the Waters Laws of the state.

As you may recall, last fall Mountain States Resources attempted to plug their wells improperly. We expect that they will come back and do the job correctly sometime this month.

ACTIVITY REPORT

On February 14, I witnessed the mechanical integrity test of Merrion's disposal well in the East Boundary Butte field. The casing held a pressure of 600 psi for 30 minutes, so the test was good.

After witnessing Merrion's test, I inspected the recent cleanup at Chuska's Black Rock 8 well where about 25 barrels of oil overflowed the stock tank on January 31. I found no evidence of the spill except for an oil stain on the old stock tank and a small amount of contaminated soil they had stockpiled at the reserve pit. Chuska installed a larger stock tank in order to prevent a reoccurrence.

The BLM held a competitive oil & gas lease sale on March 7. Melange Associates paid the minimum \$2.00 bonus for a 320 acre tract on the Luke salt deposit. This lease apparently consolidates a block of private leases they have in that area. Melange Associates was involved in the Suncor well that was drilled near Luke in 1988.

Dan and I were certified in hydrogen sulfide safety in Midland, Texas on March 12. H_2S training is essential for people who perform duties in areas where hydrogen sulfide is present. Hydrogen sulfide gas is present in the oil and gas fields of Arizona.

Ken Hand is planning to lay pipe from one of his wells at the Dry Mesa field to the gas plant at the Black Rock field. This pipe may be installed by the time we meet on April 19.

Mountain States Resources submitted a plan to re-enter and re-plug their wells at Teec Nos Pos. These wells were plugged without notice or approval in October 1990.

Petroleum Information continues to borrow logs from our

big discovery in Moals area very recently 2300 bbs. Jacy kane Creek Shale


