REPORT OF THE OIL AND GAS ADMINISTRATOR

The activity report of Mr. Rauzi was sent to the Commissioners and has been made a part of these minutes. Mr. Rauzi reported that five permits were issued to Southwest Exploration Company for stratigraphic wells at its potash project southeast of Holbrook. Southwest had finished drilling two of the holes and planned to finish the remaining holes by early August. He reported that Willcox Greenhouse LLC was drilling below 3000 ft at its geothermal well north of Willcox and that APS (Arizona Public Service Company) planned to start drilling its stratigraphic test near the Cholla Power plant next week.

INTRODUCTION OF NGS ENERGY AND ELOY STORAGE PROJECT

Ms. Van Quathem distributed handouts of selected regulations and the NGS project and discussed the Commission's jurisdiction over storage wells. Ms. Laura Luce introduced individuals from NGS Energy and gave an overview of some of NGS Energy's assets and projects around the country with emphasis on the Eloy project. Mr. Chabannes described his

background and gave an overview of the construction and operational aspects of natural gas storage facilities with emphasis on the Eloy storage project. He addressed issues such as water, brine disposal ponds, pressure gradients, and operating pressures.

Re: Activity Report for the October 16, 2009, Meeting

Six wells were drilled since your last meeting on July 17. Southwest Exploration Company drilled four stratigraphic wells at its potash project southeast of Holbrook. Southwest is holding information from the wells confidential. Willcox Greenhouse LLC drilled its geothermal well north of Willcox to a depth of 4000 ft. Willcox Greenhouse is pleased with the results and is in the process of completing the well to help heat its greenhouse. APS (Arizona Public Service) drilled its stratigraphic well near the Cholla Power plant to a total depth of 3853 ft. The Department of Energy, through the West Coast Carbon Sequestration Partnership, provided most of the funding for the APS well. The APS well revealed that the Devonian and Pennsylvanian rocks underlying the Cholla Power plant are not porous or permeable enough to sequester carbon dioxide.

El Paso Natural Gas submitted a written request to extend temporary abandonment of its AGS 1-21 well in the Picacho Basin for two years. El Paso has submitted evidence of casing integrity including stimulation and cement squeeze record and data on well tests performed to date.



Arizona Oil and Gas Conservation Commission Milestones

- 1927. First act passed by the State Legislature providing for the conservation of oil and gas and regulation of oil and gas wells. Administered by the State Land Commissioner
- 1951. Oil and Gas Conservation Act of 1951. Created the Arizona Oil and Gas Conservation Commission (OGCC) at the session of the legislature next following the discovery and production of oil or gas in the State
- 1959. The OGCC was created as a stand-alone State agency in Phoenix. Powers and duties were transferred from State Land Commissioner
- 1972. The OGCC was given jurisdiction over geothermal resources
- 1978. The OGCC was given jurisdiction over class II disposal, enhanced recovery, and hydrocarbon storage wells
- 1991. The OGCC was attached administratively to the AZGS in Tucson

Arizona Oil and Gas Conservation Commission 2008-2009 Highlights

- Issued 30 drilling permits and 14 wells were drilled in 2008
- Issued nine drilling permits and five wells were drilled through August 2009
- 51,575 barrels oil produced in 2008 at average \$90.24/barrel with estimated gross value of \$4,654,128
- 523,130 Mcf of gas produced in 2008 at average \$5.98/Mcf with estimated gross value of \$3,128,317
- 1,018,184 acres of State Trust land leased as of December 2008 at average \$1.00/acre with estimated minimum gross income of \$1,018,184
- 358,321 acres of Federal land leased as of December 2008 at average \$1.50/acre with estimated gross income of \$537,481
- Samples for 639 oil, gas, and geothermal wells representing about 2.1 million linear ft of subsurface information. Statutes require an operator to submit samples from oil, gas, and geothermal wells to the OGCC.
