REPORT OF THE OIL AND GAS ADMINISTRATOR

The activity report of Mr. Rauzi was sent to the Commissioners and has been made a part of these minutes. Mr. Rauzi reported that one new permit was issued and 11 stratigraphic wells were drilled for potash since the July meeting. Mr. Thorwald asked about the proposed GreenFire geothermal test near Springerville. Mr. Rauzi responded that he was not aware of any activity.

TRIOMPHE ENERGY REQUEST TO DRILL A LATERAL EXTENSION IN ITS TRIOMPHE #1 FEE (PERMIT 1095) IN SECTION 27, TOWNSHIP 20 NORTH, RANGE 21 EAST, NAVAJO COUNTY

Mr. Rauzi reported that Triomphe Energy submitted a written request to drill a lateral extension in its Triomphe #1. He indicated that the request and planned lateral extension were in compliance with the requirements of A.A.C. R12-7-115(B) and R12-7-107(D) and recommended approval.

Mr. Cooper asked about protection of aquifers. Mr. Rauzi noted that three cemented strings of casing to the proposed kickoff point would protect the Coconino aquifer in this area.

Mr. Thorwald moved, seconded by Mr. Cooper:

TO APPROVE THE LATERAL EXTENSION IN THE TRIOMPHE #1

Motion carried unanimously.

TRIOMPHE ENERGY REQUEST TO TEMPORARILY ABANDON ITS TRIOMPHE #1 WELL

Mr. Rauzi reported that Triomphe Energy submitted a written request to temporarily abandon its Triomphe #1 well because it could not drill the lateral extension until about May 2013 because of limited access to qualified service providers who can or are available to provide these types of

services to this remote area. He reviewed the mechanical condition and integrity of the hole, indicated that the request was in compliance with A.A.C. R12-7-125(B), and recommended approval of temporary abandonment for one year.

Mr. Cooper moved, seconded by Mr. Thorwald:

TO GRANT TEMPORARY ABANDONMENT FOR ONE YEAR TO THE TRIOMPHE ENERGY #1 WELL

Motion carried unanimously.

STATUS OF THE KINDER MORGAN PROJECT BETWEEN ST JOHNS AND SPRINGERVILLE AND POSSIBLE REPORT FROM KINDER MORGAN

Mr. White reported that Kinder Morgan started drilling the 11-3-30 Fee well (Permit 989) last week and that the remedial work announced last April was progressing nicely.

CALL TO THE PUBLIC

Mr. Dixon reported that the BLM planned a lease sale in February 2013 for 14 sections of land in the Gray Mountain area. He indicated that the minerals were federal and the surface was state on 13 of the 14 sections.



Report about permits and drilling activity for the January 18, 2013, Meeting


Eighteen new drilling permits were issued and 12 wells were drilled since your last meeting on October 19. For the year, 53 drilling permits were issued and 42 wells were drilled. All but three permits and wells drilled were stratigraphic tests for potash. The three non-potash related permits were for an exploration well near Holbrook and obligation wells at the St Johns Gas Unit.


Passport Potash drilled 24 wells west and southwest of Petrified Forest National Park. American West Potash drilled 15 wells east of Petrified Forest National Park. Triomphe Energy drilled an exploration well for oil and gas north of Holbrook; and Kinder Morgan drilled two wells in its St Johns Gas Unit.

The rulemaking proposed in the Five Year Review Report that the Commission approved in January 2012 is delayed because Governor Brewer extended the moratorium on rulemaking through December 2014.


Kinder Morgan submitted a written request to temporary abandon its 11-3-30 Fee (Permit 989), 11-25-30 Fee (Permit 1083), and future permitted and drilled wells within the St. Johns Gas Unit. This request is in accord with the Commission's motion in the January 2011 meeting (minutes attached) to retain the current status of all wells in the St Johns Unit for the term of the St Johns Unit. The Land Department stated in the January 2011 meeting that it had no objection to retaining the current status for the term of the unit. Approval of this request will facilitate the orderly and efficient development of the St Johns Gas Unit. I recommend approval of the request.

REPORT OF STATE GEOLOGIST AND DIRECTOR OF ARIZONA GEOLOGICAL SURVEY

Mr. Rauzi reported that Dr. Allison was at the fiscal year 2012 budget hearing at the legislature. He talked about two bills that Dr. Allison wanted the Commissioners to be aware of: one cleaned up language about the Commissioners' terms of appointment and the other would prevent agencies from enacting rules that were stricter than federal rules.

REPORT OF THE OIL AND GAS ADMINISTRATOR

The activity report of Mr. Rauzi was sent to the Commissioners and has been made a part of these minutes. Mr. Rauzi reported that HNZ Potash permitted ten new wells, Ridgeway drilled three wells in its St Johns Unit, and SunCor plugged its Kakerlee well at Luke since the October meeting. He noted that HNZ Potash submitted nine new applications to drill in addition to the ten they had already permitted and that Passport Potash also contacted him about permitting ten additional wells.

<u>DISCUSSION OF RIDGEWAY ARIZONA OIL CORPORATION WELLS WITHIN THE ST JOHNS UNIT AND POSSIBLE DECISION CONCERNING EXTENSION OF CURRENT STATUS</u>

Mr. Rauzi reported that Ridgeway submitted a written request to grant temporary abandonment to the three wells they drilled in November 2010 (Permits 979, 990, and 991) and retain the current status of either temporary abandonment or shut-in of all of their wells within the St. Johns Unit boundary for the term of the St. Johns Unit Agreement. He recommended approval of the request for temporary abandonment and the request to retain the current status of the wells for the term of the unit agreement.

Mr. White reported that the term of the St. Johns Unit was three years and that if Ridgeway was not actively in production or constructing a plant or pipeline in three years then the unit would go away.





Mr. Dixon stated that the State Land Department had no objection to retaining the current status to all the wells and pointed out that the three years extended from February.

Mr. Wagner moved, seconded by Mr. Cooper:

TO GRANT TEMPORARY ABANDONMENT TO PERMITS 979, 990, AND 991

Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Wagner moved, seconded by Mr. Cooper:

TO RETAIN THE CURRENT STATUS OF ALL RIDGEWAY WELLS WITHIN THE ST JOHNS UNIT BOUNDARY FOR THE TERM OF THE ST JOHNS UNIT AGREEMENT

Motion carried unanimously.

STATUS OF RIDGEWAY ARIZONA OIL CORPORATION DRILLING PROGRAM BETWEEN ST JOHNS AND SPRINGERVILLE INCLUDING POSSIBLE REPORT FROM RIDGEWAY

Mr. White discussed the recent drilling and completion techniques and better helium shows than in previous wells. He noted that testing was done with the drilling rig and because of time constraints they were not able to plug three wells that needed to be plugged. Mr. White stated that Ridgeway would plug those wells when it brought in a completion rig to conduct longer-term flow tests.

CALL TO THE PUBLIC

Mr. Dixon talked about the bill to prevent agencies from enacting rules stricter than federal rules.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Dr. Nations announced that the IOGCC annual meeting in Tucson in November was successful and described some of the speakers and topics discussed. The Commission scheduled its next meeting at 10:00 a.m. on April 15, 2011, in room 321 at the State Land Department Building in Phoenix.
